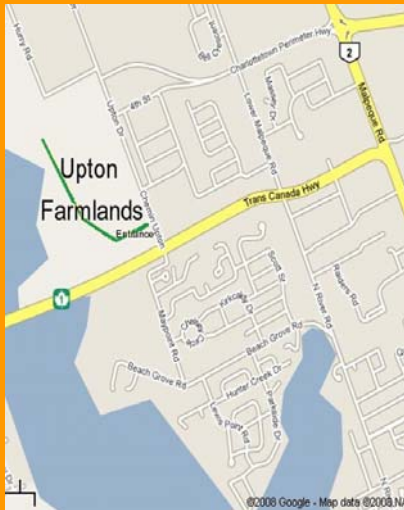
Please bring your own lawnchairs.
